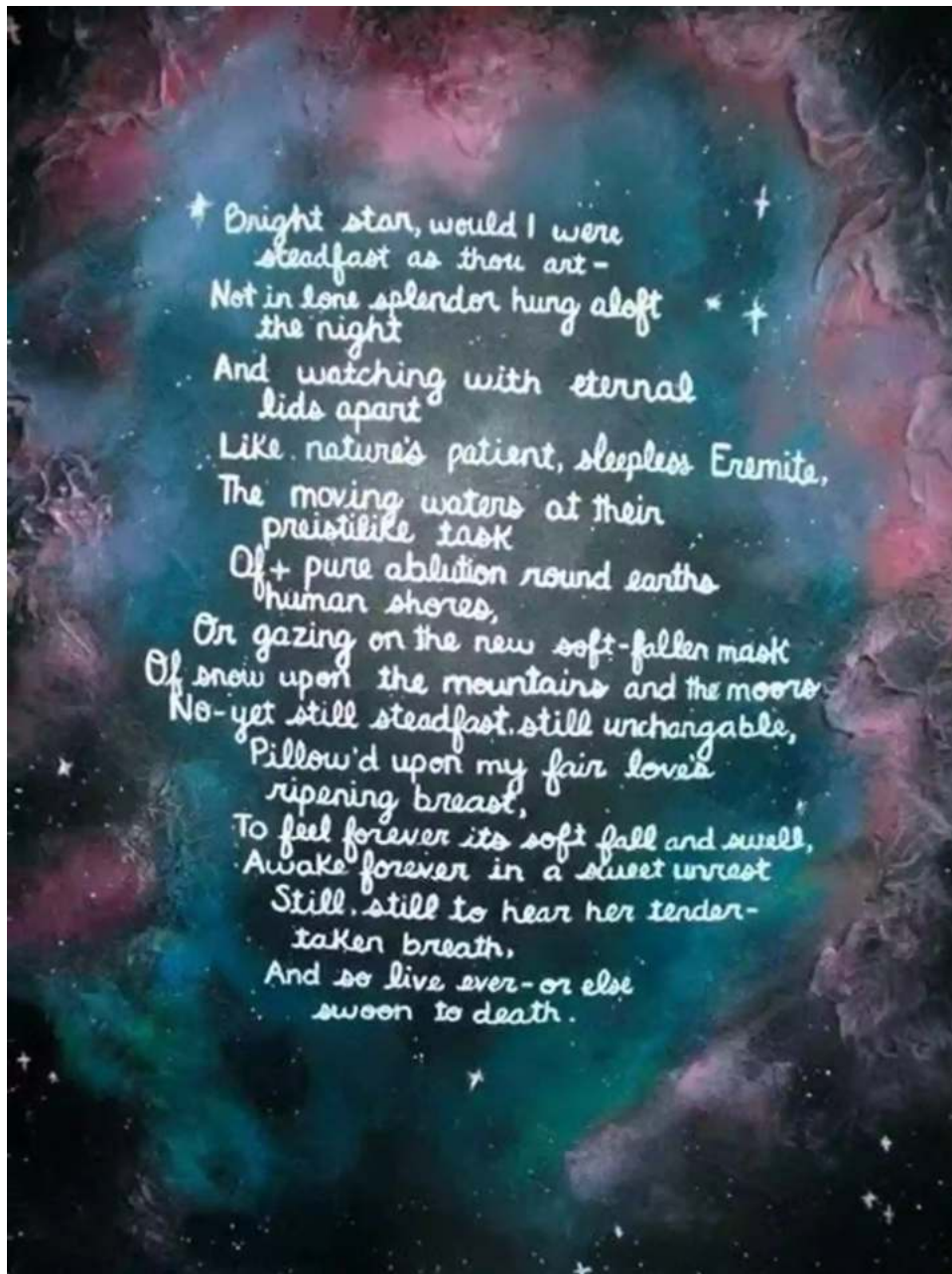


1. La Belle Dame sans Merci

And drown the wakeful anguish of the soul.

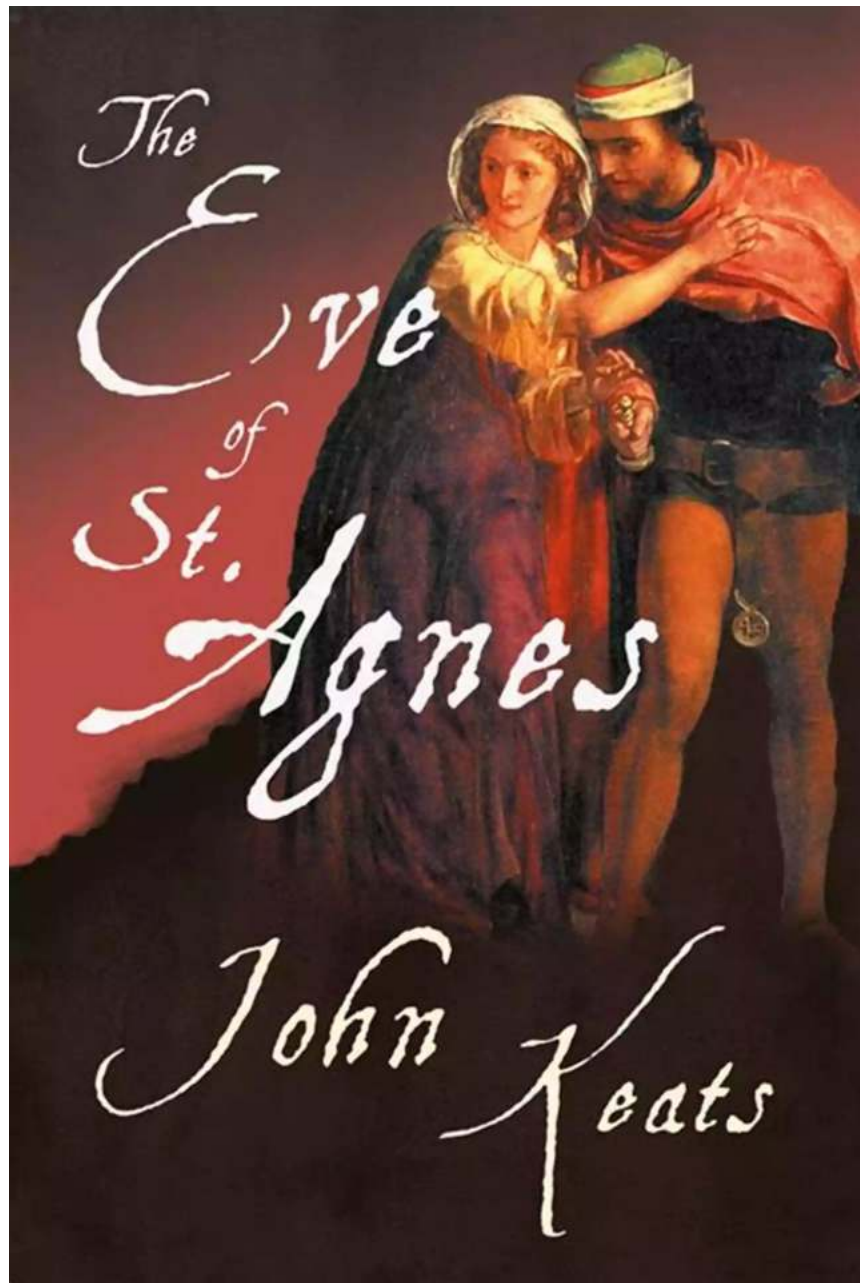
But when the melancholy fit shall fall
